

A few years ago I read Jack Canfield's book, "The Success Principles." Canfield

explains in the book a very simple but very important concept. The formula is: E + R = O (Event + Response = Outcome). Every outcome you experience in life is the result of how you have responded to an earlier event or events in your life. If you don't like the outcomes



you can make. One choice is you can blame the event (E) for your lack of results (O). This is what most people do. They don't change their response –

they simply continue to complain, blame and

make excuses about their situation. A second

choice is to simply change your responses (R) to the events (E) - the way things are until you get the outcomes (O) you want. You can change your thinking, change your communication, change your behavior – the things you do. That is all you really have any control over. If you don't like your outcomes, change your responses.

Nutrition Services is still smiling

Director of Nutrition Services

NPAS Nutrition Services staff is busy preparing for an atypical start to the school year. We were very appreciative of the communi-

ty's support of meals for distance learners last spring and what we have learned from that process has helped us plan for the new year. Some noteworthy changes are





for free. At the time of writing this article, USDA has not renewed that waiver for the Busing information can be found on the 2020-21 school year. NPAS Nutrition Services is preparing to operate breakfast and lunch programs following the regulations that were in effect and followed prior to last or reduced-price meal qualification. It is important that families complete and submit the Application for Educational Benefits prior to school starting so that unwanted negative balances are not accrued. This is especially important for families whose financial situarelated to COVID-19. In addition to receiving free meals, each family that qualifies for free or reduced-price meals assists the district with increased revenue streams and qualifica-

tion for grant programs.

As with restaurants and buffets around the country, self-service of food is prohibited. Students will be served all foods and beverages chosen. Nutrition Services is strategically planning menus to keep variety and choice, but also allow more efficient serving as well as accounting for supply chain issues.

The requirements and recommendations from the MN Department of Health are guiding the district when planning where students will eat breakfast and lunch this year.

Middle School and High School students will have a new way to pay for meals in school this year. Instead of entering a PIN number, each student will be issued a card that can be scanned without contact to access their meal account at the point of sale. Cash and checks will also no longer be accepted in the breakfast or lunch lines, and all transactions will be processed through the students' meal accounts.

Students who are opting into distance learning, or those who are at home during their hybrid rotation, will still have access to school meals. Families will be able to pre-order breakfast and lunch in advance through the Infinite Campus School Store and pick up their meals at a designated time and location

Nutrition Services staff are embracing the changes that this school year will have and are looking forward to seeing students in the buildings again. We will still be smiling, even if it is from behind a mask!






