
Boys' track & field

Number of varsity participants: New Prague has 78 boys in ninth through 12th grades out for track and field, a group including three eighth-graders practicing with the high school team.

Record a year ago: In 2022, the Trojans won the Metro West Conference East championship.

Letter-winners back this **spring:** The key returnees from the title team includes 15 upperclassmen expected to play important roles helping the team. Ryan DeNardo was new to track last year but competed at the varsity level in the high jump and hurdles. Jon Grams was all-conference in the long jump and on the 4-by-200 meter relay team. He should be one of New Prague's top sprinters and jumpers. Riley Huseby was a key varsity contributor in the middle distance and distance events last year. Liam Roufs was one of the Trojans' top 1,600-meter and 3,200-meter runners. Semai Morris earned all-conference honors in 4-by-200 meter relay and should be a key part of the sprints and sprint relays. Nino Morris is one of New Prague's top returning 200-meter and 400-meter sprinters. Ryan Schoen is a captain and a top returner in the middle distance and distance events. Matthew Schoenecker returns as one of the best shot put and discus throwers in the conference. Isaac Mejia and Luke Meger are some of the Trojans' top discus throwers. Sasha Burnham returns as one of NPHS's top shot putters. 


Areas to work on: We need to be more consistent, Holgate said. "Limiting the amount of blow-up holes is important."






